

rea•son (ree-zhun)

Reason is the capacity for logical, rational, and analytic thought.

con•science (con-shuhns)

Conscience is the inner voice that encourages you to do good and avoid evil. God speaks to us through our conscience (CCC 1776-1779).

Reason and conscience work together to help you distinguish good actions from bad ones. Reason and conscience work together to help you discover the best way to live.

All choices are not equal.

Some choices are good choices, and some are bad. And you usually know at the time if you are making a good or bad choice. The inner voice of conscience encourages you toward what is good and right.

Are you good at making decisions?

What's the best choice you made in the past twenty-four hours?

What's the worst choice you made in the past twenty-four hours?

How can you make better choices in the future?

God wants you to become a great decision maker. This is one of the reasons he sends us the Holy Spirit. Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you and counsel you—and you will find yourself making better choices.

Every day you make hundreds of choices. These choices determine the direction of your life. Sometimes you choose the best-versionof-yourself and sometimes you choose a-second-rate-version-of-

Every time you say yes to something, it changes who you are forever.

It's time to start taking your choices seriously. Next time you need to make a decision, ask the Holy Spirit to guide you.

THE THIRD PRINCIPLE: SELF-CONTROL

The opposite of self-control is slavery. If we cannot control our ability to drink, then we are a slave to drink. If we cannot control our temper, then we are a slave to our temper. If we cannot control our ability to get started, then we are a slave to procrastination. If we cannot direct our ability to work hard, then we are a slave to laziness.

God made us free. Anything that enslaves us is not from God, and therefore not the best way to live.

At different times in history some people may have thought that it was OK for other people to be slaves, but no man ever thought it was a good idea that he be made a slave.

Freedom and self-control go hand in hand.


The person who has the self-control to do what is good and right even when it is difficult or comes at great personal cost—is universally respected.

Self-control is the best way to live for everybody.



These are just three examples of how the best way to live is the same for us all. Throughout your life you will encounter people who say, "There are no absolute truths. What's true for you is not necessarily true for me!" This is relativism, and it is a lie.



What makes a good book or movie? Those that inspire you to become the best-version-of-yourself.

Why do your parents send you to school? To torture you! No, the word *education* comes from the Latin verb *educare*, which means "to draw out." Education at its best draws out the-best-version-of-you. Looking back on my life, I can see that the best teachers, mentors, coaches, and managers were all men and women who were trying to draw the best out of me.

What is the purpose of study? When you study hard you become a-better-version-of-yourself.

What is the meaning of work? Making money? No. This is a secondary outcome. The primary value of work is that when we work hard and pay attention to the details of our work, we develop character and virtue—and become the best-version-of-ourselves.

What is the purpose of marriage? Husband and wife challenging and encouraging each other to become the best-version-of-themselves, and raising children and encouraging them to become the best-version-of-themselves.

Life is about saying yes to the things that help you become the best-version-of-yourself, and no to the things that don't.

Next time you are confronted with a decision, simply ask yourself: What will help me become the best-version-of-myself?

Everything makes sense in relation to God's dream. When we feel like life is not making sense, it is usually because we have lost sight of God's vision for our lives.

God wants you to become the best-version-of-yourself. Will you choose God's dream or the modern culture's nightmare?





Freedom or slavery?











DISCUSSIONS QUESTIONS

1. DESCRIBE A TIME WHEN YOU WERE NOT "HUNGRY FOR TRUTH," WHEN YOU DIDN'T WANT TO KNOW THE TRUTH. WHY WERE YOU AVOIDING IT?

Life is a journey. Where is your journey taking you at the moment? Is it time to make a change? If it is, I hope you will have the courage to make the change.

Courage is a prerequisite for the life God has envisioned for you.

Everything in life requires courage. Whether it is playing football or coaching football; crossing the room to ask a woman on date, or rekindling a love that has grown old; whether it's your first day at college or your first day back at college after twenty years, life requires courage. It takes courage to say yes at the right times and it takes courage to say no at the right times. Your first day at work or starting a business, battling a potentially fatal disease, getting married, struggling to overcome an addiction, apologizing for something you have done, or coming humbly before God in prayer and asking: God, what do you think I should do? All require courage.

Afraid of rejection and failure, afraid of certain parts of town, afraid of certain types of people, afraid of criticism, afraid of suffering, afraid of change, afraid to tell people how we really feel, afraid of losing the things we have worked hard to buy, afraid of what our friends will think . . . We are afraid of so many things. Often, we are afraid to be the-best-

THE TRINITY

God, the Father, is the first person of the Trinity. The Father is kind, merciful, and loving, and he gives in abundance. By calling God Father, the language of faith indicates two main things: that God is the origin of everything, and that he is goodness and loving care for all his children. (CCC 239)

Jesus, the Son, is the second person of the Trinity. The Son is one person with two natures: divine and human. He is true God and true man. (CCC 464)

The Holy Spirit is the Third Person of the Trinity. He is the one whom Jesus promised the Father would send to guide and encourage us. When you think of it, the Holy Spirit is incredibly practical. How often in your life do you need guidance and encouragement?

In the Scriptures God is revealed as the Father, who created us (Genesis 1); his Son, who redeemed us (Matthew 1); and the Holy Spirit, who inspires us (Acts 1). The whole history we find in the Bible is the story of God's ongoing concern for the human family, and for each of us as his children.

Try this. Read the Gospel of Matthew. As you read about what Jesus taught, ask yourself, are these the solutions to the mess the world is in today? I think you will discover that Jesus has the antidote to the world's mess. Jesus is the solution.

What does this mean to you and me?

It is easy to say that the world is a mess. But the thing is, the more I become aware of who I really am, the more I discover that I'm a bit of a mess too. I do things every day that don't help me to become the-best-version-of-myself. And most of the time I don't actually want to do these things. Just like Paul wrote, "I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do"(Romans 7:19).

I am capable of incredible good, but sometimes I turn my back on God and his goodness. Sometimes I do it because I am stubborn and other times because I am lazy. Sometimes I turn my back on God and his goodness because the right path just seems too hard, and other times because I am selfish and just want what I want.

The truth is, I am a sinner, and sinners need a Savior. The world is a mess and I am a mess, but Jesus came to fix the mess. That's good news.

THE JESUS PROPHESIES

There have been lots of famous people throughout history. Neil Armstrong was famous for being the first man to walk on the moon. Rosa Parks was famous for standing up for justice. Pablo Picasso was famous for his paintings. Mozart and Beethoven were famous for their music. Christopher Columbus was famous for discovering the Americas. Shakespeare, Dickens, Tolstoy, and Austen were famous for their writings. But all their fame came during their lives or after they died. And it was largely the result of what they did.

Jesus was famous before he was born, and he was famous because of who he was—the long-awaited Messiah. Lots of people get written about while they are alive or after they die, but Jesus was written about hundreds of years before he was born.

ISAIAH 11 PROPHESIED that the Messiah would be a descendant of David. **MATTHEW 1:1** shows that this prophecy was FULFILLED.

GENESIS 49 PROPHESIED that the Messiah would be born of the tribe of Judah, one of the twelve tribes of Israel. **MATTHEW 1**: FULFILLED.


MICAH 5 PROPHESIED that the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem. MATTHEW 2: FULFILLED.

ISAIAH 7 PROPHESIED that the Messiah would be born of a virgin mother. LUKE 1: FULFILLED.

PSALM 72 PROPHESIED that kings would come and adore the Messiah. **MATTHEW 2:** FULFILLED.

PSALM 41 PROPHESIED that the Messiah would be betrayed. MATTHEW 26: FULFILLED.

ZECHARIAH 11 PROPHESIED that the Messiah would be sold for thirty pieces of silver. **MATTHEW 26:** FULFILLED.

But Jesus doesn't just love that way; he calls us to love in the same way. (I told you he was radical.)


On Sunday at Mass, after the Gospel has been read, I ask myself, "If I lived this one Gospel reading 100 percent, how much would my life change?" The answer is the same every week: radically.

There is a gap between my life and the life God invites me to live. There is a gap between the person I am and the person God created me to be. I have a long way to go. But I have started and I hope you will join me in the journey.

Most people think they are pretty good Christians. I even know non-Christians who think they are pretty good Christians. But compared to what? Compared to Jesus? No, most people don't use that as their measuring stick. Compared to the Gospel? Most people don't use that as their measuring stick either. Most compare themselves to what they see on television or to their peers. In most cases today this can be setting the bar very low indeed.

If you really want to explore the question of the best way to live, I recommend you get yourself a Bible and just start by reading the Gospel of Matthew. Read it slowly. Think about what you're reading. This way you will save yourself a lot of heartache and discover the path that leads to lasting happiness in this life and eternal happiness with God in the next life.

Along the way you will also discover the real Jesus, and you might discover he is very, very different to what you had previously thought.



JESUS IS THE HEALER OF MY SOUL,



Matthew's Gospel is one of the four Gospels and the first book of the New Testament. Scholars believe it was written between AD 70 and 110, and that it was written by a Jewish author, for a Jewish Christian audience. The way Matthew tells the story of Jesus draws on many symbols from Jewish tradition to emphasize that Jesus is the long-awaited Messiah.

3.5 DECISION point

The Gospel of Matthew is my favorite. Maybe it is because my name is Matthew. Maybe it's because so many times I decided I would read the New Testament from start to finish and didn't get much past Matthew, so it is the Gospel I am most familiar with. But I think the reason is because the images, parables, and practicality of Matthew's Gospel resonate with me deeply.

In the ninth chapter we come across the story of the call of Matthew. It simply says:

"As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax booth; and he said to him, 'Follow me.' And he got up and followed him." (Matthew 9:9)

Matthew woke up and went to work as a tax collector that day just like he did on any other day. He didn't know his whole life was about to change. That's how God works. Our God is a God of surprises.

Jesus' invitation to Matthew is one he makes to us all. There is no great fanfare; he simply says, "Follow me."

Will you?

Will you follow Jesus?

Maybe you're not ready to make that decision. That's OK. But if that is the case, you have a responsibility to learn more about who Jesus is, so that you can decide to follow him or not. If you are really not sure if you want to follow Jesus, read the Gospel of Matthew, and get to know him more.

But don't just avoid the question. God doesn't like that. We read in the book of Revelation, "You are neither hot nor cold... So, because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I am about to spew you out of my mouth." (Revelation 3:15–16)

Like Matthew the tax collector, today might feel like a regular day for you. But it isn't. Deciding to follow Jesus—or not to follow Jesus—is one of the biggest **decision points** you will come to in your life.

Invite Jesus into your heart and into your life, decide today to follow him, and many years from now, you will look back and know that today was a turning point in your life.


When I was a child I was taught to start my day by offering everything that was going to happen that day to God. This prayer is called a morning offering. There are many different versions; this is the one I was taught:

STEP 1 GRATITUDE

Begin by thanking God in a personal dialogue for whatever you are most grateful for today.

STEP 2 AWARENESS

Revisit the times in the past twenty-four hours when you were and were not the-best-version-of-yourself. Talk to God about these situations and what you learned from them.

STEP 3 SIGNIFICANT MOMENTS

Identify something you experienced in the past twenty-four hours and explore what God might be trying to say to you through that event (or person).

STEP 4 PEACE

Ask God to forgive you for any wrong you have committed (against yourself, another person, or Him) and to fill you with a deep and abiding peace.

STEP5 FREEDOM

Speak with God about how He is inviting you to change your life so that you can experience the freedom to be the-best-version-of-yourself.

STEP6 OTHERS

Lift up to God anyone you feel called to pray for today, asking God to bless and guide them.

STEP7 PRAY THE OUR FATHER

4.5 DECISION point

Over and over throughout the Gospels we read about Jesus going to quiet places to pray.

Mark 1:35: "In the morning, while it was still dark, he got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed."

Matthew 14:23: "After he had dismissed the crowds, he went up a mountain by himself to pray."

Luke 5:16: "Now more than ever the word about Jesus spread abroad; many crowds would gather to hear him and be cured of their diseases. But he would withdraw to deserted places and pray."

Luke 9:28: "Jesus took with him Peter, James, and John, and went up on a mountain to pray."

Why did Jesus withdraw so often to pray? He was God, right? True. But he was also man. Imagine the distractions. The fame. The people who were trying to convince him to be a political or worldly leader. The people who were trying to use him for their own benefit. He withdrew to pray so that he could stay focused on his mission, to remember what really mattered.

We all get confused about what really matters from time to time. Prayer helps us to keep things in perspective.

We live in a noisy, busy world. If you are going to work out who you are and what you are here for, you need to step back from it all for a few minutes each day to reconnect with yourself and with God.

What place does prayer have in your life today? Is prayer at the center of your life or on the periphery of your life. Give prayer a central place in your life. Place prayer at the center of your life and amazing things will begin to happen.

Find a place where you can spend a few minutes with God each day. Set aside a time at the same time each day for prayer. Make this place and time a sacred part of your day, and God will fill you with his wisdom so you can make great decisions every day.

To pray or not to pray? That's your decision point today.

Here's my challenge for you: Practice The Prayer Process every day for thirty days. After thirty days I hope you are convinced that prayer should remain a daily habit for the rest of your life.

Do you pray only for yourself? If so, your geography of prayer is pretty small—tiny, in fact! As Christians, we believe we are called to pray for the whole world, and as such, the geography of our prayer should take in the whole world. When I was in high school I was given a rosary. Each of the five decades was a different color and represented a different region of the world. The idea was to offer each decade for the people in those different regions, thus praying for the whole world.

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First decade (green beads): Pray for Africa

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Second decade (red beads): Pray for the Americas

Third decade (white beads): Pray for Europe

Fourth decade (blue beads): Pray for the South Pacific

Fifth decade (yellow beads): Pray for Asia

Prayer is powerful. If we love our neighbor, we will pray for our neighbor. As Catholics, the geography of our prayer even reaches beyond this world when we pray for our loved ones who have died, that they may be united with God in paradise.

The geography of prayer is just one of millions of beautiful realities that make up our faith.



The Bible was originally written in Hebrew and Greek, and has been translated into more languages than any other book. It was written by hundreds of different authors between approximately 1500 BC and 100 AD.

In the Old Testament God reveals himself as the Creator who is deeply interested in a relationship with humanity. In the New Testament he reveals his mercy and overwhelming desire that all people experience his love—more proof of God's incredible yearning for a relationship with us.

If you want to get a sense of what the Old Testament is all about, read Genesis. The book of Genesis demonstrates that there is a great cause-and-effect relationship between obedience to God and happiness, and between disobedience and misery. Genesis shows us, over and over again, what happens if you follow the ways of God and what happens if you follow the ways of the world. In Genesis we see an in-depth study of the human condition.

The New Testament presents the life and teachings of Jesus Christ and the life of the early Church.

All this might lead you to ask, where did the Bible come from?

It did not fall from Heaven as a single book. Nor did God dictate it mechanically to scribes. God chose certain people whom he inspired to write down what he wanted to convey to humanity. The Bible came together over the course of more than sixteen hundred years, and hundreds of authors were involved in writing the Bible as we know it today.

You could spend your whole life just studying Sacred Scripture and it would be a life well spent. And truth be told, very few lives are really well spent. I hope you spend yours well and I hope this program is helping to prepare you for that.

But if you did spend your whole life studying the Bible you would discover that it is not just a theological book. The Bible is immensely practical. It can show you how to get to Heaven, but it can also show you how to live on earth. In many ways it is a guide to a happy life.









5.5 DECISION point

Thirty minutes to speak about the most important book in the world is nothing. So as I prepared to speak to you about the Bible, I asked myself, "What do you hope to accomplish with this session?" I came to the conclusion that I could teach you very little about the Bible in such a short time. So I set out with two objectives:

- 1. To give you a starting point so that you would feel comfortable picking up the Bible and beginning to read it.
- 2. To give you an appetite for reading the Bible.

So, I want to encourage you to get yourself a good Bible and make reading it a part of your day. When you go looking for a Bible, remember, not all Bibles are the same—so get yourself a good Catholic Bible. The Catholic Bible has seventy-three books, but many other Christian Bibles have removed books and those Bibles usually contain only sixty-six. Visit DynamicCatholic.com and we will help you find a good Catholic Bible.

If you really want to surprise your parents, ask them to get you a Bible as an early Confirmation gift.

Last week I was speaking to my friend Brian in San Diego, and he was talking about his Bible. He has had it for years, reads from it every day, and it is well worn. Something he said to me struck me particularly: "You need a good Bible to do life with."

Here's my challenge: Wear out a Bible in your lifetime. Get a really good one, and wear it out with prayer and reflection.

Dozens of voices are influencing you and the direction of your life every day. But how often do we pause and allow God to speak into our lives? Reading the Bible for a few minutes each day is a great way to allow the voice of God to speak into the situations and circumstances we are dealing with.

If I were going to spend the rest of my life on a deserted island and I could only take one book with me, I would take the Bible. I hope in time you will come to feel the same way.

The Bible is a map and an instruction manual, but it is also an invitation to get to know God and his Church. Will you accept the invitation to get to know God? Or will you reject it? What role are you going to allow the Bible to play in your life?

You get to decide.

Get yourself a Bible. Take a few minutes each day to read it. I'm telling you, it will change your life in the most incredible ways.

RELATIONSHIPS

The world says that the secret to having great relationships is common interests. Common interests are good, but they are not the key to great relationships. Your interests ten years from now will most likely be very different from your interests today. Throughout our lives our interests are constantly changing and evolving. And if you build a relationship on common interests, if you make common interests the most important thing, and your interests change—the relationship will change. And it will very often fall apart.

Purpose matters. The foundation you choose to build your relationships upon matters. Think about the story from Matthew's Gospel. Jesus said:

"Everyone who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house upon the rock; and the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat upon that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on rock. And every one who hears these words of mine and does not do them will be like a foolish man who built his house upon the sand; and the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell; and great was the fall of it." (Matthew7:24–27)

Fun is great, but it is not enough. Common interests are fabulous, but they are not enough. Building relationships upon fun or common interests is like building a house on sand. Great relationships need common *purpose*. Building relationships upon the common purpose of helping each other become the-best-version-of-ourselves is like building a house on rock.

If you want to build your relationships on sand, choose your friends based on whether or not they are good-looking, fun, athletic, rich, and popular. If you want to build your relationships on rock, choose friends of good character, who are striving for virtue, who help you become the best-version-of-yourself, and lead you closer to God.

The more closely we align ourselves with the purpose of anything, the more success we will have. Relationships have a purpose. God gives us relationships to help us become the best-version of ourselves.

The beautiful thing about the purpose of relationships is that it is unchanging. Like the rock that the wise man built his house on, common purpose is a solid foundation to build your relationships upon. Many things may change in your life over the next month, year, or decade, but the purpose of relationships will not.

Are you ready to start building your relationships on a solid foundation?



The Trinity - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit - is the most dynamic relationship, and your relationship with God will have an enormous influence on every other relationship in your life.

Every yearning you have for good things is in some way a yearning for God. Your longing for relationship is a yearning for God. God is relationship. So, no wonder you yearn for relationships so much.

Throughout your life you are going to make lots of relationship decisions. You are already making dozens every day. Are you making good relationship decisions? What can you do to make better relationship decisions? Do you understand how some of the decisions you make today will impact your life in the future?

There is a great Scripture I want to invite you to reflect upon today. When we really think about what it takes to have great relationships, it can be overwhelming. In John's Gospel, Jesus says, "the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything. . ." (John 14:26) The Holy Spirit will teach you everything . . . including how to have great relationships.

Open yourself up to the Holy Spirit's guidance. Try it. Don't take my word for it. At least once a day for the next week, pray to the Holy Spirit and ask him to guide you in a specific situation. 


